PARISH DEMOGRAPHICS



Our parish has 1041 registered families an increase of 15 families since July 2019 The majority of our parishioners reside in Voorheesville, Slingerlands, Altamont, Delmar, Guilderland, the Hilltowns and suburban Albany zip codes. Our parish is clustered with St. Lucy's/St. Bernadette's, Altamont, Christ the King, Westmere and St.

Thomas, Delmar. We are members of the Beverwyck Vicariate. The October 2019 Mass count showed an average number of 566 people per weekend. During COVID-19 Pandemic we taped liturgies during the pandemic "pause" and averaged 250 views. Upon reopening our average in church attendance was 210 people with an average online of 150 viewers. We currently have 371 families contributing through weekly envelopes and 81 E-giving families an increase of 13 families since July 2019. A total of 249 families contributed to the 2019 Bishop's Appeal with total gifts of \$81,559. The 2020 Diocesan Appeal (formerly the Bishop's Appeal) was a direct mailing from the Diocese. As of end of October 83 families have pledged \$27,754.00

2019-2020 FAITH DEVELOPMENT AT ST. MATTHEW'S CHURCH



We know that this year was one like no other! We thank God for the many blessings that helped us persevere through the challenges brought by the COVID-19 pandemic:

In the fall of 2019, we welcomed new and returning participants to our parish-wide faith formation program: Generations of Faith. Our 2019-2020 theme was: "Seasons of Faith: Following the Church Calendar to the Heart of Catholicism." Although our final session was cancelled due

to the pandemic "pause," we continued to connect with our households and provide weekly faith formation opportunities throughout the spring and summer by way of the *Seasons of Faith* electronic newsletter: Produced by our Faith Development team here at St. Matthew's, the mission of the *Seasons of Faith* newsletter is to provide lectionarybased, Gospel-centered faith formation for St. Matthew's households on the go. From reflections to activities to poetry to prayer, these weekly resources are designed to help households of all ages, sizes and shapes to live, learn and grow in. This summer, we opened *Seasons of Faith* to the whole parish and now welcome anyone to sign-up to receive this resource. (Contact Joy Galarneau at <u>stmatthewsfaithdevelopment@verizon.net</u> to be added to the list.) We are now also producing the newsletter all year, not just during the academic year.

- Our sacramental preparation programs started off and finished up strong, despite the pandemic pause in the middle! In September of 2019, 36 teens and 2 RCIA candidates were confirmed at a beautiful liturgy at St. Matthew's Church. We then jumped right into our 2019-2020 preparation year with 29 Confirmation candidates and almost 20 Peer Mentors. During the pause, Confirmation candidates were encouraged and supported by Mrs. Chrisi Young, Coordinator of Youth Ministry, through many creative means. Although they were facing their own challenges, these compassionate and resilient teens still found time to write letters to members of our parish family and share their love. In the summer, the candidates finished up their preparation with zoom and then in-person sessions, as well as a beautiful reconciliation retreat. We are thrilled to share that the teens were confirmed at the Cathedral just a few weeks ago along with two RCIA candidates. What a celebration! Speaking of celebrations, we could not have been more grateful and excited to celebrate First Communion with 30 amazing young parishioners at 4 special Masses this past August. They had patiently been waiting to do so since May. During their "pause," First Communion families received weekly "First Communion Connection" lessons, participated in a zoom service project, and once we could gather again in small groups, participated in final preparation retreats. We were inspired by this resilient group of young parishioners and their families, who showed us that First Communion could be beautiful and meaningful, masks and all.
- We offered three adult Bible studies again this past year, though the final one was "paused" mid-way through we are so happy to be starting up our Bible Study again this fall, with limited seating and safety measures in place. Our Pastoral Associate for Faith Development, Joy Galarneau, is now also teaching Bible studies and facilitating programs at the Dominican Retreat Center. As of now, those programs are online – we will share these opportunities as they become available.
- In July we were delighted to welcome Mrs. Anne Miller to the Faith Development staff as our new part-time Coordinator of First Reconciliation and First Communion. Mrs. Miller brings a wealth of experience and expertise in education and catechetical leadership. Bringing Mrs. Miller on staff has allowed Joy Galarneau to continue to serve as director of our faith development ministries here at St. Matthew's and reduce her hours to half-time.
- We spent the summer developing plans for our 2020-2021 faith development programs. Thanks to our Generations of Faith team an amazingly dedicated group of volunteers and staff, we are offering a hybrid GOF program this year, which includes an onsite option featuring small cohorts as well as a virtual option. Mrs. Miller and Mrs. Young have also planned and kicked off creative and meaningful sacramental preparation programs for the 2020-2021 year. As we move forward into a new year, we lift up our whole family of faith and pray for a year of blessings, growth, good health, and love. We thank our parish for all of your support and prayers!



Since guests were not able to be housed in our classroom wing and remained at the Day Center; meals were prepared and delivered to the Day Center during our assigned weeks.
