Dear Friends,

In every age, the timeless nature of scripture speaks to us in particular ways. Consider this reading from the Gospel of Luke (14:16-23).

"A man gave a great dinner to which he invited many. When the time for the dinner came, he dispatched his servant to say to those invited, 'Come, everything is now ready.' But one by one, they all began to excuse themselves. The first said to him, 'I have purchased a field and must go to examine it; I ask you, consider me excused.' And another said, 'I have purchased five yoke of oxen



and am on my way to evaluate them; I ask you, consider me excused.' And another said, 'I have just married a woman, and therefore I cannot come.' The servant went and reported this to his master. Then the master of the house commanded his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in here the poor and the crippled, the blind and the lame.' The servant reported, 'Sir, your orders have been carried out and still there is room.' The master then ordered the servant, 'Go out to the highways and hedgerows and make people come in that my home may be filled."

Great things happen at banquets. Gifts are shared. Friendships are renewed. Old wounds are healed. New life is celebrated. Losses are mourned. We are nourished body, mind and soul. God throws His banquet as a gift to savor, not a chore to be endured.

Some are back to Mass and to other parish community events.... but a lot are still missing. In every age we can find excuses to stay away.... which is why this reading is so timeless. In this particular age we might be apt to add one more excuse: "COVID is keeping me away from the banquet". For some that is still a valid reason. For others who are out and about doing other things, it rings hollow.

People are asking me, "Fr. Rick, how will you get people back to church?". Here is my response: "What is needed in an invitation from you". The parish has prepared the banquet. We have beautiful liturgies with good music and good homilies in a sacred space. There are other community events highlighted in this report as well. As families and a society in general, it seems that we have lost the expectation that coming to the banquet is part and parcel of who we are. Only the people can change that.

Please, make a concerted effort to remind everyone that we are here. Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in your friends and neighbors. Invite the poor and the crippled, the blind and the lame. Tell everyone why you come to the banquet...as gift to be savored beyond duty to be endured. Only when you do that, will the banquet hall be filled.

2021-2022 Faith Development at St. Matthew's Church

St. Matthew's faith development programs continued to have an enriching and blessed experience during the 2021-2022 year. With the cooperation of our Faith Development team and a dedicated group of volunteers, we were able to facilitate many faith-filled experiences.

- Generations of Faith (GOF) offered two in-person sessions each month, with 38 families participating. Our theme, "Come to the Table," centered on the Mass. Each session focused on a part of the Mass, and offered some in-depth, hands-on experiences to help develop a richer understand-ing of the Eucharist. In Advent we took a deeper look at the Nativity, using our puzzle solving skills to "unlock" the Nativity stories and prepare our hearts for Christmas. Everyone had great fun breaking open the Word. Our final session was a "teaching" Mass with Fr. Rick as the celebrant.
- In the fall of 2021, the First Communion program kicked off with 14 new candidates. In addition to attending all of the GOF sessions, the candidates participated in three retreats, and in May they celebrated their First Communion with our entire church family. Every candidate was able to serve as readers or gift bearers! Celebrating such an important day at our regular weekend Masses again was certainly a highlight of the year.






